<p>Make a calendar of your week. With a parent's help, add two chores to do during the week.</p>	<p>Label 10 index cards with the numbers 0-9. Using paint or colored water and an eye dropper, put the proper number of dots on each card.</p>	<p>Fill a lidded glass jar with water and add 2 tablespoons of baby oil. What happens to the oil in the water? Add 3 drops of food coloring in a primary color. What happens? Add 3 drops of another primary color. What happens?</p>	<p>Paint a picture. Try a variety of techniques with your brush and with your hands. How can you paint dots? Lines? Can you make the paint show different textures?</p>	<p>Plan a picnic in your backyard for your stuffed animals or dolls. What items can you use as pretend food? What else do you need for a picnic?</p>
<p>Help wipe the table after a family meal.</p>	<p>Use play dough or modeling clay to make something fun. Take a photo of it.</p>	<p>Help an adult prepare a meal for your family.</p>	<p>Read a counting book.</p>	<p>Find and describe five different textures while playing at a playground, the pool, or the beach.</p>
<p>Get a large box and create something.</p>	<p>Play in a sandbox or in the sand at the beach.</p>	<p>Help unload the dishwasher.</p>	<p>Write your name in shaving cream.</p>	<p>Fold the hand towels and kitchen towels in the laundry.</p>
<p>Watch the birds in your neighborhood. Find a book about birds at the library and see if any of the birds you saw are in the book.</p>	<p>Choose a dozen objects from around your home and figure out how many syllables are in the names of those objects.</p>	<p>Count all the windows and doors in your house. Describe the shapes you see in them.</p>	<p>Use play dough and modeling clay. Compare them: how do they feel the same? How do they feel different?</p>	<p>Find a beautiful flower. Try to make a collage with construction paper that looks like the flower.</p>
<p>Set the table for a family meal.</p>	<p>Fold or roll towels for the pool or beach bag.</p>	<p>Play a board game with your family.</p>	<p>Clean a window or mirror in your house with glass cleaner and a rag.</p>	<p>Draw a picture of you doing something fun in summer.</p>
<p>Take a photo of something you did today. Have an adult write the date below the picture so you can trace it.</p>	<p>Pour your own milk into your breakfast cereal.</p>	<p>Use objects like string, sponges, Q-Tips, and a small square of cellophane or Saran Wrap to paint.</p>	<p>Count to 20.</p>	<p>Choose 3 letters and have an adult write them on index cards. Trace the letters. Find 3 things in your house that start with each sound.</p>
